

North Dakota Q&A

1. Can people with a past felony conviction register and vote?

The right to vote is suspended during the term of imprisonment – parolees and those on probation may vote.

2. Can victims of domestic violence, assault or stalking keep their address private if they register to vote?

North Dakota has no formal address confidentiality program, but any individual who has a valid protective order or a valid restraining order has their records automatically secured. The voter's registration information will not be disclosed.

3. How do people experiencing homelessness register and vote?

North Dakota doesn't have voter registration, however to qualify as a voter one must be a resident. Residency can be established by a permanent dwelling or any other abode – the rule is construed broadly to include non-traditional residences.
